"Flying Cheetah's" S.A.A.F Korea

In July 1953 U.N. Forces and North Korea signed a truce, which ended 3 years of conflict, but as yet no Peace Treaty has been signed. The S.A.A.F. entered the air war fray on November 16 of 1950, with No. 2 "Flying Cheetahs" flying their Mustangs into airfield K-9 at Pusan. The unit joined the 18th

FBW as it made its move into North Korea and was therefore attached to the 18th FBW for the duration of the war. The Cheetahs flew with great courage and bombing accuracy contributing to the 18th's overall effectiveness. Many F-51's suffered heavy battle damage and were able to fly or glide back to friendly territory crash landing their fighters. U.S. ground crews were always available to assist the South Africans with repairs.

SAAF records show 95 Mustangs were bought; with 74 lost to all causes... the greatest cost were the 34 pilots killed or MIA.

Conversion to the F-86F

In December of 1952 the "Cheetahs" turned in there Mustangs at Kisarazu AB. Starting in January new F-86-30's arrived, however initially flying dual-controlled T-33's until

Airline Chatter by Terry Love

Emirates Airlines, the Dubaibased airline, is expanding greatly. They plan to hire 3,000 cabin crew this year. Most will be foreign – mainly European. This will meet the demands of its expanding fleet and network.

Delta Airlines plans to begin non-stop service from Minneapolis to Mexico City on December 1 using Airbus A-320 aircraft.

United Airlines announced the route that they will operate when the new Boeing 787 Dreamliner comes online. It will fly from Houston to Auckland, New Zealand on November 16, 2011.

Delta Airlines will hire about 300 pilots this year. The majority, if not all, will come from Delta's regional airlines like Mesaba, Pinnacle, etc.

Airbus is on track for the Airbus A-350 to fly in 2013. The Airbus A-350 is Airbus's version of the Boeing 787 Dreamliner.

Aeroflot, the Russian airline, ordered up to 65 Boeing 787-800s, beating rival Airbus. The order is for 50 firm aircraft, and an option for 15 more. Aeroflot does say it will continue to buy and use Airbus airliners. Presently Aeroflot flies 67 Airbus aircraft. Capitalism beats Communism again!!

Airbus delivered its 30th Airbus A-380 on Friday, June 4 to Lufthansa.

Emirates Airlines, in one of the most expensive airliner orders in history, ordered 32 Airbus A-380 super jumbo double-deck airliners. Cost is around \$11 Billion. This is Airbus's largest ever order. Emirates Airlines is the largest Arab world's airline.

TAM, Brazils largest airline, ordered 25 Airbus A-320s worth \$3 Billion. This order and the above Emirates order were announced at the Berlin Air Show. TAMs order consists of % Airbus A-350s worth about \$1.3 Billion, and 20 Airbus A-320s worth about \$1.7 Billion.

Finnair, the Finnish airline, ordered 5 Airbus A321ERs. This was part of the announcements from Airbus at the Berlin Air Show. Cost is \$485 million.

Germania, a German charter airline, ordered 5 Airbus A-319s worth \$372 million. This was the last order announced at the Berlin Air Show.

Continental Airlines announced its first African route with a daily flight from Houston to Lagos, Nigeria starting on November 11, 2011 using a Boeing 787 Dreamliner as flight equipment.

Boeing announced that the Boeing 787 Dreamliner passed

its 1000th test flight hour. About 40% of t he flight tests are now done. There have been very few glitches in the flight test program. The sixth 787 will join the fleet on June 30th.

Employment in the U S airline industry fell 4.1%, extending a 22 month slide that has brought total employment to its lowest levels since the Transportation Department began keeping statistics in 1990.

its pilots were considered ready to solo, by March 31 the "Cheetahs" received all there Sabres. Once all squadron pilots had soloed, the first order of business was to master fighterinterceptor tactics. Maintenance of the Sabres was truly a UN effort with all three squadron crewman assisting each other "Cheetahs" group. The participated in the massive May Day raid against the Pyongyang radio tower. The SAAF Sabres had the tri-colored chevron of the 18th FBW in the colors of there air force.

The F-51D is a 1/48 Hasegawa kit. It was an easy build, painted with Testors silver spray paint. I utilized the kit decals, which are a bit inaccurate in color where the red Springbok should have been SAAF orange. This represents No. 2 Squadrons #36, "Miss Marunouchi" in 1952, carrying rockets and napalm.

The F-86F-30 is a 1/48 Academy kit. Was an easy build, although you have to mind the fit as you marry both fuselage halves, watch it behind the cockpit. Secondly if you like them buttoned up, you can get a better fit of the machine gun panels by gluing the machine guns in place first. This will give you overall support of the panel from sinking into the panel cut-out. The decals are from AreoMaster 48-711 SAAF Sabres. This is from 1952 at Osan AB, No 2 Squadron, "#611 F "Danny Boy"". The SAAF orange is correct on these decals.

Directions to the Club Meeting Location

Where: South St. Paul Municipal Airport, a.k.a. Fleming Field, located on the southern extremity of South St. Paul, south of 1-494, west of Concord Street and East of Highway 52.

If coming from the western Twin Cities going east on 494:

- Exit at the 7th and 5th Avenue exit (Exit No.65)
- Turn right (South) on 7th Ave and go approximately .6 miles to a 4-way Stop sign. This is South Street W. To your left there will be a McDonald's; to your right front there will be a Walgreen's.
- Turn left (East) at the 4-way Stop onto
- South Street W and go approximately .6 miles. Along the way you will encounter three more Stop signs—the third Stop sign (Henry Avenue) will be a "T" intersection. At the "T" intersection on your left will be homes and on your right softball fields.
- Turn right (south) onto Henry Ave. and go approximately .2

 miles toward the Fleming Field airport terminal building.

If coming from east Twin Cities on westbound 494:

- Exit at the 7th and 5th Avenue exit (Exit No.65)
- Turn left (South) on 7th Ave and go approximately .6 miles to a 4-way Stop sign. This is South Street W. To your left front there will be a small strip mall; to your right there will be an Amoco station.
- Turn left (East) at the 4-way Stop onto
- South Street W and go approximately .4 miles. Along the way you will encounter two more Stop signs—the third Stop sign (Henry Avenue) will be a "T" intersection. At the "T" intersection on your left will be homes and on your right softball fields.
- Turn right (south) onto Henry Ave. and go approximately .2 miles toward the Fleming Field airport terminal building
