The "Sun Setters", were the VLR Mustang pilots of the 15th, 21st and 506th Fighter groups, VII Fighter Command based on Iwo Jima

The 506th FG was delivered by ship to Guam on March 17th 1945, a week later the unit flew to Tinian. Seven weeks of CAP

and practice missions were flown while North Field on Iwo was prepared for their arrival. Finally on May 11, the FG landed at North, but first combat missions didn't occur until May 18th when the weather cleared. Black Friday, June 1, took its toll on the 506th losing its formation leader Lt. Col. Scandrett, Capt's. Edmund Crenshaw and Lawrence Smith, 2nd Lt's James Best, Robert Kripple, Robert Griffeth, Leonard Kloiber, William



Saks, Thomas Kerrigan and Robert Harvey, 1st Lt's Gale Loomis and Archie Ridley along with the rest of the VII fighter command, as 24 pilots lost there lives and not one to enemy fire. all to mother nature.

"HEL-ETER(left side) / LIL – TODDIE(right side)" #527 were flown by 1st Lt's. John W. Winnen and Phillip G. Alston, as in most cases there were more pilots than planes. This was the late paint scheme with the solid green tail, early paint job had green striped tail as in aircraft #550. #527 was lost in August while Alston was on leave in Hawaii.

458th FS P-51's were assigned numbers 550 to 599 and was commanded by Maj. Harrison Shipman.

"Madam Wham-Dam" #550, was piloted by Maj. Shipman. However on the fateful "Black Friday" Lt. Col Scandrett deputy commander of the 506th was flying the plane and did not return. The blue striped tail was the initial markings of this unit until later in June when they became solid blue, as in aircraft #527. 462nd FS P-51's were assigned numbers 600 to 649 and was commanded by Maj. Thomas D. DeJarnette.

"Dina B" #615 was piloted by Lt. Willie Willis which shows several mission markings. However I have no other information on this pilot or plane. These were the initial markings of this unit until later in June when they became solid yellow.



Airline Chatter by Terry Love

Southwest Airlines says that they will keep the newly acquired 86 Boeing 717s (DC-9) from the Air tran merger.

Shandong Airlines of China, bought 15 Boeing 737-800s. The value of the deal is \$1.2 Billion.

China Eastern Airlines started out the new year by ordering 50 Airbus airliners for \$3.2 Billion. All aircraft orders from China must have approval of the Communist government. In fact, they place the orders for the airline.

Delta Airlines is planning to scale back the use of their 50seat regional jets used in smaller markets.

Easy Jet, the low cost airline of the UK, ordered 15 Airbus A-320s and canceled an order for the A-319s already on order. Presently, Easy Jet has a fleet of 182 Airbus A-320s.

Boeing announced that CIT Aerospace, a leasing company, ordered 38 Boeing 737-800s. Cost is \$3.15 Billion.

Asiana Airlines of Korea, ordered 6 Airbus A-380s worth around \$1.78 Billion.

Boeing received 530 net orders for the 737-800 series. This is up by 142 from 142 for 2009. Boeing delivered 462 airliners in 2010. Boeing delivered 74 Boeing 777s, and received 46 net orders in 2010.

Boeing said that all 683 Boeing 757-200 models must be inspected for cracks. American Airlines has 124 Boeing 757s.

Boeing's milestone for

airline of India, ordered 180 Airbus A-320s worth \$15.5 Billion. Delta Airlines' last flight of a DC-9-40 was on December 31, 2010 when the last flight was flown from Orlando to Sanford, Florida. Boeing has just built the 1,000th Boeing 767 model. It was for All Nippon Airways. Three decades after it was introduced, the 767 has just 50 deliveries left before production ends to allow more room for 787 production. Unless the U S Air Force orders the 767 as their next tanker, the last 767 will be built in less than two years.

Delta Airlines recently completed installing lie-flat seats in business class in all 8 of their Boeing 777-200ERs. Next lie-flat seats in business class will be installed on all 767-400ERs, 767-300ERs, and Airbus A-330-200s, and A-330-300s. A total of 79 aircraft will be done by this

Airbus announced the world's biggest commercial aircraft order. Indigo, the low cost airline of India, ordered 180 Airbus A-320s worth \$15.5 Douglas DC-9-50s. All were former North Central Airlines and then Republic Airlines aircraft.

Delta Airlines is considering a huge aircraft order for up to 200 aircraft to modernize, and consolidate its fleet. Over half of the order would be for a singleaisle version with deliveries beginning as early as 2013. A full order of 200 jets would set a record. Filling the order with 200 Boeing 737-800s would cost \$16.2 Billion. Narrow body airliners make up more than 80% of Delta's fleet. Douglas DC-9-50s were first delivered in 1976 -35 years ago - but they still have lots of life left in them, and are economical to operate on a perseat basis. Delta Airlines wants to reduce maintenance costs, and fuel costs.

Mexicana Airlines declared bankruptcy and ceased operations last August. But they returned to service on January 24. They will start off by operating six Airbus A-320-s over 8 different routes - six of which are to America. Mexicana's goal is to return to using 28 of their parked airliners. 2,000 employees were called back from the 8,000 previously employed.

United Airlines/Continental Airlines is also considering more airliners, like rival Delta Airlines. United Airlines is looking for a little over 100 new narrow-body airliners.

Interjet, the lowcost airline of Mexico, ordered 15 Russian Sukhoi Superjets for \$650 million. Superjets look like a DC-9 and hold 98 passengers. Currently, Interjet has 22 Airbus A-320s.

Airbus sold 574 airliners in 2010 worth \$74 Billion. Boeing sold 530 airliners is 2010 worth \$80 Billion.

Virgin America Airlines ordered 60 Airbus A-320s for \$5 Billion. This order includes the 10,000th Airbus aircraft to be built by Airbus in their 40 year history.

Boeing says that deliveries of the new 787 Dreamliner will begin in July of this year.
